Key Learnings

Vaccines are just as important for adults as they are for kids

- Our immune systems get weaker with age, making vaccines even more important
- Most adults are not up to date with their vaccines, putting them at serious risk
- Staying up to date with your vaccinations is the best way to stay healthy

Preventable diseases are a serious risk

- The seasonal flu, shingles and pneumonia are the "Big 3" common preventable illnesses that threaten older people (and we have senior-specific vaccines for all of them!)
- Seniors are at by far the highest risk for hospitalization and death from the "regular" flu
- Older people who end up in the hospital from the flu, shingles or pneumonia often suffer long-term life-altering effects, including cognitive decline, loss of independence and frailty

You deserve to be healthy

- Coverage for senior-specific vaccines is inconsistent across the country (Ontario has better than average coverage)
- The vast majority of older people can't get vaccinated due to cost and barriers to access (the vaccines are too hard to find)
- Advocates like CanAge are working hard with the government to improve the lives of you and your loved ones, including making sure you can get the best-in-class vaccines!
