Consent and Capacity Board (CCB)

The Consent and Capacity Board is a quasi-judicial administrative tribunal which operates at arm's length from the Ministry of Health under the authority of the Health Care Consent Act.

Represent a Client: Canada Revenue Agency (CRA)

Represent a Client is a service that provides safe online access to an individual's tax information. This service is available for anyone who is able to access information on behalf of someone else.
